






General Information

- The manuals are a comprehensive planning basis for barrier-free building in Berlin's construction
- Along with the instructions, "Barrier free concept" ,they intended to provide assistance in the planning process.
- They intend

- The instructions are arranged chronologically by the planning stages of a public construction project in accordance with the General Instructions for the preparation and execution of construction projects in Berlin.

1. Phase - Program Requirements

• In space, function, and equipment including operating concept are quantitative and qualitative requirements for barrier-free construction to formulate.

2. Phase - Planning

- The cooperation between owner, planner and consultant has a significant influence on a good result.
- Experts to design for all, advisors and / or affected agencies are involved in the planning process already in the first design ideas
- Participation of People with disabilities or their commissioners
- preciese List of requirements

3. Building design (design planning, construction planning document, detailed design)

- developed on the basis of further planning
- concept drawings and text to be presented as part of the planning documents in 1:100 scale.


4. Phase – Detail Design

• From 132 City Train stations are 116 Stations accessible (in 2018 = 100%)






